Left and Right - Traced Hands

Trace a child's hands to teach him or her the difference between left and right!

Materials Needed:

8 1/2 x 11 brightly colored construction paper

Brightly colored

Child's hands!

Instructions:


1. Copy the set of instructions onto the page.
2. Using brightly colored markers, trace the hands onto the page in the boxes labeled "left hand" and "right hand".
3. Using brightly colored markers, trace the hands onto the page.
4. Make sure the hands are facing the right direction.
5. Place the construction paper over the worksheet.
6. Put the child's left hand onto the paper in the box labeled "left hand". Trace the left hand with a brightly colored marker.
7. Put the child's right hand onto the paper in the box labeled "right hand". Using the same colored marker or a different colored marker, trace the right hand.
8. Have the child wash the marker off his or her hands.
9. Clean up!

Left and Right - Painted Hands

Paint & print a child's handprints to teach him or her the difference between left & right!

Materials Needed:

8 1/2 x 11 brightly colored construction paper

Brightly colored markers

Several paper plates

Paint brushes

Tempra paint - various colors

Child's hands!

Instructions:

1. Copy the second page of this worksheet onto the paper.
2. Using brightly colored markers, draw the outline of the hand in the box labeled "left hand".
3. Using brightly colored markers, draw the outline of the hand in the box labeled "right hand".
4. Pour different colors of paint into separate bowls.
5. Make sure the child's hands are clean.
6. Brush child's left hand with enough paint to make a good imprint. Press left hand onto the paper in the box labeled "left hand".
7. Using the same color paint or a different color paint, brush child's right hand with enough paint to make a good imprint. Press right hand onto the paper in the box labeled "right hand".
8. Have the child immediately wash the paint off his or her hands.
9. Lay paper out to dry. Clean up!



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Left and Right - Glitter Hands

Trace & glitter a child's hands to teach him or her the difference between left and right!

Materials Needed:

8 1/2 x 11 brightly colored construction paper

Brightly colored markers

Pencil

Bottled glue (not gel)

Colored glitter

Child's hands!

Instructions:

1. Copy the second page onto construction paper.
2. Using brightly colored markers, draw the possessive form.
3. Using brightly colored markers, draw the possessive form.
4. Make sure the children have their hands clean.
5. Place the construction paper on a clean surface.
6. In pencil, trace the child's left hand onto the paper in the box labeled "left hand".
7. Trace the child's right hand onto the paper in the box labeled "right hand".
8. Go over the traced handprint lines with glue.
9. Sprinkle with colored glitter making sure to cover all the glue.
10. Pour off excess glitter.
11. Lay paper out to dry. Clean up!

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
